

## SPRING COTTAGE, CLIVEDEN, UK

Built on the banks of the Thames as a summer house for the Countess of Orkney, the idyllic 19th-century Spring Cottage (below) has a storied history: at the heart of the Profumo affair, it was where Stephen Ward and Christine Keeler would meet. In summer, there are vintage launches on which to cruise and riverside gardens for champagne picnics. In colder weather, a snug with board games and traditional country kitchen - with, of course, duck-egg blue Aga - are cosy hideaways for lazy afternoons. ## VILLA BASMAH, LE JARDIN DES DOUARS, MOROCCO

The sleepy seaside town of Essaouira is a world away from the mania of Marrakech, and the three capacious villas at the terracotta Le Jardin des Douars (right) are ideal spots for groups who want to escape. The largest, Villa Suite Basmah, is spacious enough to comfortably accommodate a multi-generational family, who can relax in private alcoves, then gather on the terrace, around the pool or

in the landscaped gardens for traditional feasts made by the villa's private chef. Sleeps 10; from £390 a night, b&b; jardindesdouars.com




## NELSON MANDELA CENTRE, SOUTH AFRICA

Once the South African leader's private countryside retreat, the Nelson Mandela Centre for Reconciliation is in the Shambala Private Game Reserve in the country's north Limpopo Province. Although spotting Big Five creatures is the prime reason to stay anywhere else on the 10,000hectare reserve, Mandela's home (above), filled with his personal possessions and favourite artworks, is a destination in its own right. Testament to that fact can be found in the property's guestbook, still on display and featuring lines of thanks from the likes of Bill Clinton and Oprah Winfrey. ## VILLA ROCKSTAR, EDEN ROCK, ST BARTHS

Though the denizens of St Barths have long been accustomed to celebrity visitors, those seeking anonymity still head to Eden Rock St Barths' Villa Rockstar (below). Flanked by a walled garden, and set alongside a beach, the property provides every conceivable amenity to party privately. Alongside the cinema, gym and pool (a facility strangely unavailable in the neighbouring hotel), the villa has a whiskey bar and recording studio fitted with the mixing console used by John Lennon to record Imagine. A dedicated butler and chef are also on hand



to clear up any rock-stars'
post-party detritus and
serve a late breakfast on the
12-person dining table.
