

## BITTIMOTITE OFFI-

WHERE TO STAY In the hills above Essaouira a laid-back seaside town with sandy beaches on Morocco's west coast - lies the picturesque Le Jardin des Douars, a 26-room residence set

among beautifully kept botanical gardens. All the rooms are adorned with Moroccan art, textiles and lamps, and have a real rustic charm. There are even traditional hammam kits

in each bathroom!

Foodies will love the two restaurants in the resort, where you can feast on local catch of the day and Moroccan favourites such as lamb tagine. Families are made to feel welcome, but if you're on a romantic has holidayed break, there's also a couples-only dining area - and afterwards you can enjoy a drink outside under the stars. On a Sunday, they do a huge BBQ lunch, which includes tasty swordfish, fresh salads and desserts.

Relaxation is the order of the day here, so there are no TVs in the rooms. Instead you're encouraged to switch off and relax by the pool and in the gardens, where turtles and a peacock roam freely.

You can also go horse riding, zip through the sand dunes on a quad bike or try your hand at windsurfing.
